Beach Fees, Rules and Regulations:

Beach Badges must be worn at all times, visible on the front of the bathing suit. This applies to the Ocean Beaches and entire Bay front. Seasonal and weekly badges can be purchased at the Beach Badge Office, which is located at 1306 Grand Central Avenue. Daily badges can be purchased at the ocean and bay beaches from the badge checkers. The badge fees for the summer of 2017 Season are as follows:

- No fee for children under the age of twelve (12) years.
- \$50.00 per person, per season. Season badges available throughout the season. Season badges purchased prior to June 12, 2017 are \$40.00.
- \$30.00 per person for each weekly badge. A “week” is defined as the period from Saturday through the following Saturday.
- \$10.00 per person for each daily badge.
- \$15.00 per person for the entire bathing season for any person whom is 65 years of age or over, or is totally disabled, or a disabled veteran of any military service or is a military-service personnel on active duty status.
- Beaches officially open June 17th and close September 4th. Badges are required during that period. Lifeguards are on duty from 10:00 am – 5:00 pm. Weekends and holidays until 6:00pm.

Beach Rules and Regulations

- It is unlawful to throw or drop waste paper, garbage and other refuse on the beach as well as litter, destroy or disfigure the beach or public or private property.
- It is unlawful to use loud, profane or indecent language, play ball or engage in any activities, which will endanger another person or interfere with the enjoyment of the quiet use of the beach or public boardwalk.
- It is unlawful to conduct or engage in any beach party, picnic or similar outing, cook, or take any alcoholic beverage upon said places of resort, other than non-alcoholic beverages in cans or plastic containers.
- Surfboarding will be allowed only in prescribed surfboard areas indicated by green flags. Shock cords must be attached and used at all times. Haddonfield, Brown and Trenton Avenues.
- Bathing is permitted in protected areas only. Lifeguards are equipped with radios for emergency purposes. A white flag indicates safe bathing conditions. A red flag indicates no swimming. A yellow flag indicates restricted swimming. Wait until conditions are right before bathing. Lifeguards enforce safety rules, please cooperate.
- Vehicles are not allowed on the beach from May 1 to September 15, or on any weekend in September. At all other times vehicles

must be operating in accordance with Chapter 7-11 of the Borough Code. Operators must be licensed and vehicles must be registered. \$35.00 permit is required.

- Please keep off all sand dunes. Sand dunes are protected by Chapter 8 of the Borough Code. Violators will be issued a summons.
- Smoking is prohibited on the bay beaches, Chandler Field and playground area, the Gazebo grounds and Jacobson Park.
- The digging of large holes on the beach poses a danger to children from potential cave-ins and also presents a problem for beach personnel.

Recreational Activities:

Tennis, shuffleboard, basketball, bocce ball and horseshoe courts are available. Shuffleboard, bocce ball and horseshoe equipment is available at the Tennis Court Shed. Tennis permits will be issued beginning June 17th. Court fees are \$5.00 per hour. Shuffleboard 8am on Tuesdays for seniors. Pickle ball is also available.

Swimming Lessons: Ages 5-10. All levels of ability. Children placed accordingly. June 26th thru August 4th, 9:00 am – 12:00 pm. 30 minute sessions by ability, two days/week. Reese Avenue Bay Beach.

Junior Lifeguards: Ages 13-15 with good swimming ability. Swimmers must be able to swim 100 yards non-stop. July 3rd thru July 27th, Tues. & Thurs. at 10:30am. Philadelphia Ave. at the Ocean. Applications are available at Beach Badge Office or Call 732-793-2111.

Summer Recreation Programs: Aerobics – Mon, Wed, Fri. 8 am at the Basketball Courts; **Tai-Chi** – Tues, Thurs. 8am at the Basketball Courts; **Zumba** – Tue, Thurs. 8am at the school; \$5 per person at all sessions. Session times are subject to change; up-to-date information available on website.

Bicycles:

TO HELP PREVENT THEFT KEEP ALL BIKES LOCKED.

Bicycles are permitted on the boardwalk during the bathing season between the hours of 5:00am thru 10am. Bicycle riding is prohibited on sidewalks in the business area. Bicycle riders on highway must obey all NJ State Laws and local ordinances. RIDERS MUST KEEP TO THE RIGHT AND MUST NOT RIDE AGAINST THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC. THIS PROVISION WILL BE ENFORCED.

- Ride on right side of the road, with traffic, as close to the side of the roadway as possible.
- **Bicyclists must observe one-way highways. Traveling south on the northbound highway or north on the southbound highway is strictly prohibited and extremely dangerous.**
- **All children under the age of 17 must wear a safety helmet while riding bicycles, roller or inline skates or skateboards .**
- At night, bicyclists must have a white light in front and a red light in back, both visible for at least 500 ft.
- Only one person may ride on a bicycle, unless it is designated otherwise.
- Bicyclists must ride single file only.
- Bicyclists must observe all traffic signals and signs.

Parking: June 17, 2017 through September 4, 2017

A sticker is required on motor vehicles parked in any of the Municipal parking lots on the bay front. Car Stickers are \$10.00 and must be permanently affixed to the driver's side rear window. A separate sticker is required for any motor drawn vehicle or trailer parked in any of the Municipal parking lots on the bay front and allows use of the municipal boat ramp. Trailer Stickers are \$50.00 and are to be permanently affixed. Stickers are available at the Beach Badge Office. Commercial Trailer Stickers are available for \$100.00 and are required all year. "NO PARKING" as designated from the end of the streets on the ocean front; this area is reserved for emergency vehicles.

Lavallette Emergency Notification System:

The notification system allows our officials to record a message and send that message to every telephone number listed in the directory within a matter of minutes. Whether residents need to be informed of a water main break, a fast-moving fire, approaching storms, or other crisis, the notification system is the most efficient way to reach them with the news.

The Emergency Notification System will send messages to a database of telephone numbers and email addresses.

Animals:

Must be on a leash and are not allowed on the beach or other places of resort at any time. Animals on a leash can only be taken on the boardwalk at times other than regular bathing season. Feces must be removed immediately. Do not dispose of feces in storm drains. All storm drain flow into the Barnegat Bay. All cats and dogs must be licensed each year.
