

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOROUGH OF LAVALLETTE GOOSE PATROL

In accordance with §6-4(A) of the Code of the Borough of Lavallette, all canines participating in the Borough of Lavallette Goose Patrol must be licensed and display the license and evidence of membership whenever performing patrol functions.

Owners of the Goose Patrol canines are responsible for the behavior of said canine while performing patrol functions. Goose Patrol Membership can be revoked for negative canine behavior while performing patrol functions.

Membership of the Goose Patrol is limited to residents, property owners, and renters or tenants of the Borough of Lavallette, year round barrier island residents, and no more than ten (10) members who either do not reside, do not own property, ~~or~~ do not rent or are not tenants of the Borough of Lavallette or do not reside year-round on the barrier island. For the purpose of these rule and regulations, the barrier island shall be defined as the area between and including Curtis Point in the Township of Brick to Ortleigh Beach in Township of Toms River.

Goose Patrol canines can ONLY be present during the following circumstances:

- Municipal parks while these areas are NOT in use by other non Goose Patrol citizens;
- Chandler Field/ball field and the open field bordering Bay Blvd. while these areas are NOT in use by other non Goose Patrol citizens;
- If at any time the Geese Police are patrolling these areas and non Goose Patrol citizens arrive to utilize that area, then the patrol dogs MUST leave immediately.
- All Goose Patrol canines patrolling the resort area along Bay Boulevard must be on a leash at all times.
- Goose Patrol canines are not permitted in the playground area within Chandler Field Park

Failure to remove and properly dispose of canine feces shall constitute cause for immediate revocation of Goose Patrol membership.
