### Beach Fees, Rules and Regulations:

Beach Badges must be worn at all times, visible on the front of the bathing suit. This applies to the Ocean Beaches and entire Bay front. Seasonal, weekly and daily badges can be purchased at the Beach Badge Office, which is located at 112 Jersey City Avenue near the library. Daily badges can only be purchased at the badge office. No badges can be purchased from badge checkers at the beach.

The badge fees for the summer of 2022 Season are as follows:

- Everyone age of twelve (12) years and older need a badge.
- \$60.00 per person, per season beginning June 1, 2022. Season badges available throughout the season. Season badges purchased prior to June 1, 2022 are \$55.00.
- \$35.00 per person for each weekly badge. A “week” is defined as the period from Saturday through the following Saturday.
- \$12.00 per person for each daily badge.
- \$20.00 per person for the entire bathing season for any person whom is 65 years of age or over.
- \$15.00 for totally disabled
- No charge for disabled veteran of any military service or military-service personnel on active duty status.
- Beaches officially open June 18<sup>th</sup> and closes September 5<sup>th</sup>. Badges are required during that period. Lifeguards are on duty from 10:00 am – 5:00 pm. Weekends and holidays until 6:00pm.

### Beach Rules and Regulations

- It is unlawful to throw or drop waste paper, garbage and other refuse on the beach as well as litter, destroy or disfigure the beach or public or private property.
- It is unlawful to use loud, profane or indecent language, play ball or engage in any activities, which will endanger another person or interfere with the enjoyment of the quiet use of the beach or public boardwalk.
- It is unlawful to conduct or engage in any beach party, picnic or similar outing, cook, or take any alcoholic beverage upon said places of resort, other than non-alcoholic beverages in cans or plastic containers.
- Surfboarding will be allowed only in prescribed surfboard areas indicated by green flags. Shock cords must be attached and used at all times. Haddonfield, Brown and Trenton Avenues.
- Bathing is permitted in protected areas only. Lifeguards are equipped with radios for emergency purposes. A white flag indicates safe bathing conditions. A red flag indicates no swimming. A yellow flag indicates restricted swimming. Wait until conditions are right before bathing. Lifeguards enforce safety rules, please cooperate.

- Smoking is prohibited on all beaches, boardwalk, Chandler Field, Gazebo grounds Jacobson Park, and playground areas.
- Umbrellas - No umbrellas larger than 8’ in diameter or tents larger than 10’x10’ permitted. Tents minimum of 15’ apart.
- The digging of large holes on the beach is prohibited because it poses a danger from potential cave-ins and also presents a problem for beach personnel. Smaller holes must be filled in before leaving.

### Recreational Activities

Tennis, Pickle Ball, shuffleboard, basketball, volleyball, bocce ball and horseshoe courts are available. Shuffleboard, bocce ball and horseshoe equipment is available at the Tennis Court Shed. Tennis & Pickle Ball Court fees are \$5.00 per hour beginning June 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Swimming Lessons: Please see website closer to summer to see if this program will be available in 2022.** Ages 5-10. All levels of ability. Children placed accordingly. Please see website for dates and times. 30 minute sessions by ability, two days/week. Reese Avenue Bay Beach.

**Junior Lifeguards: Please see website closer to summer to see if this program will be available in 2022.** Ages 13-15 with good swimming ability. Swimmers must be able to swim 100 yards non-stop. Please see website for dates and times. Philadelphia Ave. at the Ocean. Applications are available online and at lifeguard Head Quarters 732-793-2566.

**Lavallette Emergency Notification System:**

The notification system allows our officials to record a message and send that message to every telephone number listed in the directory within a matter of minutes. Whether residents need to be informed of a water main break, a fast-moving fire, approaching storms, or other crisis, the notification system is the most efficient way to reach them with the news.

The Emergency Notification System will send messages to a database of telephone numbers and email addresses.

**Bicycles:**

Bicycles are permitted on the boardwalk during the bathing season between the hours of 5:00pm thru 8pm. Bicycle riding is prohibited on sidewalks in the business area. Bicycle riders on highway must obey all NJ State Laws and local ordinances. **RIDERS MUST KEEP TO THE RIGHT AND MUST NOT RIDE AGAINST THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC. THIS PROVISION WILL BE ENFORCED.**

- Ride on right side of the road, with traffic, as close to the side of the roadway as possible.
- **Bicyclists must observe one-way highways. Traveling south on the northbound highway or north on the southbound highway is strictly prohibited and extremely dangerous.**
- **All children under the age of 17 must wear a safety helmet while riding bicycles, roller or inline skates or skateboards.**
- At night, bicyclists must have a white light in front and a red light in back, both visible for at least 500 ft.
- Only one person may ride on a bicycle, unless it is designated otherwise.
- Bicyclists must ride single file only.
- Bicyclists must observe all traffic signals and signs.
- Remember to lock your bike when you leave it, even if you're leaving it for only half a minute.

**Parking: June 18, 2022 through September 5, 2022**

“NO PARKING” as designated from the end of the streets on the ocean front; this area is reserved for emergency vehicles. A sticker is required on motor vehicles parked in any of the Municipal parking lots on the bay front. Car Stickers are \$10.00 and must be permanently affixed to the driver's side rear window.

**Boat Ramp**

A separate sticker is required for any motor drawn vehicle or trailer parked in any of the Municipal parking lots on the bay front and allows use of the municipal boat ramp. Trailer Stickers are \$50.00 and are to be permanently affixed. Stickers are available at the Beach Badge Office. Commercial Trailer Stickers are available for \$100.00 and are required all year.

**Handicapped Accessible Parking:**

**Stop for pedestrians in the crosswalks! It's The Law!**

The driver of a vehicle must stop and stay stopped for a pedestrian crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk, but shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection, except at crosswalks when the movement of traffic is being regulated by police officers or traffic control signals.

**Animals:**

Must be on a leash and are not allowed on the beach or other places of resort at any time. Animals on a leash can only be taken on the boardwalk at times other than regular bathing season. Feces must be removed immediately. Do not dispose of feces in storm drains. All storm drain flow into the Barnegat Bay. All cats and dogs must be licensed each year.

### Borough of Lavallette AutoPay and E-Bills:
